1st I desire all my just debts to be paid, and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner — as for the worldly goods which it has please God to give me I desire it may be distributed as follows that is to say.

1st I desire that my well beloved wife Polly Hollistown may have one third part of my estate. Then my wish is that my father and Mother Henry & Sally Hollistown shall have one half of the remaining parts of my estate, and the Balance to be equally divided among all of my Brothers and Sisters namely James Richard & Enoc Hollistown Sally Jane, Melanody Bowles, Sally Walters & Elizabeth Sammons, and lastly I do Constitute and appoint Edward Gile the Executor of this my last Will and Testament made this sixth day of September 1823.

I Now all men by these presents that I Samuel Scott of the County of Barren and State of Kentucky have made this my last Will and Testament, in the name of God, Amen.

First I Will and bequeath Sarah and Jack my Negroes free after my death from all men the giving good security for their good behavior. There are to be free from all Masters friends blood relations or neighbours having my full desire for them to Work and maintain them themselves. At present I am in my good and common sense such as I ever had. after my lawful debts is paid selling the property to the amount of the same. I then wish the following Distribution of my property. First to Sarah one bed and to Jack, the same that is one bed with the furniture for each of them (to John Hamill I Will my Shoe) and after all my debts is paid and my funeral expense is also paid the balance of what property I may have, I wish, to be equally divided between Sarah, and Jack, them to be free from all men for ever as Witness my hand and seal this 9th day of May in the year of our Lord 1823 — leaving John Hamill my whole share of this my last will and Testament.
