I William Froggett of the County of Lamar State of
South Carolina being of sound mind and perfect health
and recollecting that all men must die do hereby
make this my last will and testament in these words
I give to my son John William Froggett
William the tract of land in which I now live
containing about two hundred and thirty two acres
to be equally divided between them my other property
of every description and wherever found I give unto
my daughter Betty James Patsy Froggett to be
equally divided between them my little house and
furniture to be first paid — I do hereby will &
desire that my spouse and four daughters to have
as they remain single have a house them where
now live with sufficient land upon it
to live William Froggett dead this 18th day of
May 1863 signed sealed in presence of
William Rogers, William Froggett Jr.

I Mary Rountree of Lamar County being sound in
mind and disposing memory but knowing the
uncertainty of Death do make and ordain this as
my last will and testament in these words
I give to my son John Rountree one dollar having heretofore given
him what I consider to be his share I give to
my son Richard Rountree one dollar he having also
land heretofore had as much as I intend to give him
I give unto my son in law David S. Mayfield
one dollar he with Lucy formerly Lucy Cox
having heretofore had her share I give unto
my son Samuel Rountree one dollar he having heretofore
had as much as I intend him to have I give to
the children of my daughter Peggy Bates one dollar each
that mother having also heretofore had as much as I
intend her to have I give to my grand son
Adam Rountree the following negroes a little negro
girl named Mary a negro boy named David a
negro boy named John a negro girl named
Ann and the tract of land on which I now
live I give to my grand son James Cox
my negro boy named David and one feather bed furniture
I also my will and desire that my grand son
Adam Rountree have another tract of land
belonging to me containing one hundred and fifty
eight acres I give to my daughter Betty Cox
a negro girl named Mary I give to my grand son
John Cox one negro woman called Big Annie I give
to my grand son John Cox a negro man called Tom
I should not sell said negro before I die and about
condition also that the said John Cox pay me the value of
said note he owes me I give to my grand son
Richard Cox one hundred dollars and the best of my
two I give to my grand son Adam Rountree
one of my trunks my daughter Lucy & Betty one each
I give to my grand son Adam Rountree my bureau
with drawers and I give to him all my other
furniture to Adam Rountree my capstan &c I give
to said John and Adam Rountree my cherry table
I give to my grand son David Cox five of
my old wooden chairs I give to my grand son
Adam Rountree my cherry pipe I give to said
John one looking glass but leave the other to Adam Rountree
