I give to my beloved wife Lucy Pool during her natural life, all the Land that I may be possessed of, all the provisions and hardware together with the sugar and coffee sent for by Edward Clark, to be purchased at New Orleans, all my household and kitchen furniture, Plantation Utensils Crop growing & choice Negroes, all the Horses & Cattle & the Cart, fifteen head thoroughbreds, twenty head Choice Sheep, fifty head Choice hogs, my Silver Watch, and what money I have on hand and is out on interest, I wish kept, at interest for her benefit, and if she should stand in need, to use the principal from time to time as she may need it, except four half Eagles, which I give to each of my children, viz Elizabeth & book Mary L Pool, William L Pool, and John Pool, I will that she furnish my son William with a horse, when he is of age. Also my son John Pool a horse saddle and bridle when he is of age, out of the assets in her hands. The balance of my Negroes including those that have been put in possession by me with their increase of my daughters, Elizabeth & book and Mary L Pool to equally divided between my four children. After the decease of my said wife Lucy Pool, it is my Will that all the dispossession shall be equally divided between my four children, viz Eliz. & book, Mary L Pool, William L Pool & John Pool, or their legal heirs. All property not disposed of above, I Will that it be disposed of at Public Auction, and the proceeds to be put out to interest of the duration of my wife affairs will admit of it and the proceeds to be for her benefit, I appoint my wife Lucy Pool sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament and Will that she shall not be bound to security, for the fulfillment of the same, as Hilman my hand and seal this 17th June 1827.
