 and State of Kentucky being in sound mind the week in May do
 make and declare this my last Will and Testament It's my will
 and desire that my last will should first be paid out of the moneys due
 me or out of my personal property and after the discharging of my last debts
 It's my will and desire that my wife Elizabeth should have the balance
 of my Estate during her natural life or widowhood and should any
 time think proper at any time she may sell the land whereon we
 now live by her purchasing of one hundred acres of Land equal value
 when she may think proper and at the close of my wife's life or widow-
 hood It's my Will and desire that the land that my wife should
 own should be equally divided between my two sons Green Hall
 and John Hall Hall It's my will and desire that at the close of my
 wife's life or widowhood that my son Green Hall should have uppear-
 ance Ruffen and Cross and Green's moneys should there be arriv-
 ed, also one bed and furniture, and one half of my stock of horses Daniel
 Wright, also one half of the plantation also bills It's my will and desire
 that at the close of my wife's life or widowhood that my son John Hall
 should have my servants Jacob and Judith and children's moneys
 should have be an entire herafter, also one bed and furniture and my
 coat called Daniel with one half of the remainder of my stock of horses that
 may be in hand at my wife's death or marriage also one half of my plant-
 ation moneys. It's my will and desire that if any my wife should
 think proper that she may sell as many as two of the Negroes out of
 my stock of Negroes that is not specifically given and the proceeds
 of the sale out of land which land is at her death or marriage to be equal-
 ly divided between our three sons Daniel, Green and John Hall It's my will
 and desire that if my son children that is the state of Missouri at this
 time should arise and live by a covenant to my wife until her death
 or so many as may remain and where live by her shall have three equal
 share of all property that may not be specifically given and
 this will make all of them that do not return and live by my wife's death
 or marriage there shall be so much of my property sold over and
 above what will take back to pay my last debts as will give to each one
 five dollars that do not share and comply with the conditions here-
 in mentioned, It's my will and desire that if my children John Hall James
 Hall Thomas Allen Margaret Anderson and Anna do not return
 and comply with the conditions of this will that in the
 division of my property not particularly named between my children
 still living here into those that may return from the Missouri
 and comply with the within conditions that should the Negroes given
 my son Green Hall and John Hall there not be costs as much as the
