I Robert Snoddy of the County of Barren and State of Kentucky of lawful age & disposing mind and memory, being mindful of the certainty of death; do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament.

First I give to my daughter Nancy Lewis, one Negro girl named Mary estimated at four hundred and fifty dollars— Also one Negro Girl named Wesley estimated at four hundred and fifty dollars— Also I do hereby forgive my son in law John Lewis a debt of eighty dollars which he owes me for that amt. paid for him to James Jell— Also a further Debt of fifty dollars due me by said Lewis in the exchange of Haggons— And I do further give to my said daughter one debt due me by bond on the build Eggs of Virginia for five hundred and fifty two dollars together with the interest thereon from the 15th Nov. 1817 amounting now to six hundred and thirty dollars, which several Legacies amt. in all to sixteen hundred & sixty dollars Nevertheless if it should so happen that the above named debt on Eggs cannot be collected owing to insolvency or otherwise, that then & in that event, my Will is

is that the amt or so much as may be so lost shall be made up to my said daughter out of my estate at the final division hereof as is herein after directed.

Second: I have heretofore given my daughter Elizabeth Thurman of Virginia the following articles which I do hereby confirm first, one Negre Girl named Selby estimated at four hundred and fifty dollars also four hundred dollars in cash and also a part of the tract of land on which I live in Virginia estimated at eight hundred dollars, which several sums and in all to sixteen hundred & fifty dollars.

Third: I give to my son bary A. Snoddy one Negre boy named Lewis estimated at four hundred dollars—

Fourth: I give to my son John Snoddy one Negre ^{named hane} boy, estimated at two hundred & fifty dollars—

Fifth: I give to my daughter Polly Snoddy one Negre girl named Charlotte estimated at three hundred dollars

Sixth: I give to my son Robert Snoddy the saw mill and land that I bought of Jeremiah Everts together with all the land I own on the North side of the South fork of Beaver Creek, being a part of this tract whereon I now live I also give to my son Robert Snoddy one Negre boy named Pauline estimated at five hundred dollars value; to him and his heirs forever.

Seventh: I give to my grand son Robert Haskens Lewis one Negre boy named George (being James youngest child) to him and his heirs forever.

Eighth: I give to my dear wife Sophia during her life, the whole of the tract of Lane otherwise I ~~name~~ live, lying on the South side of the South fork of Beaver Creek; and at her death to be equally divided between my sons bary and John in such manner as they may agree. I also give to my wife for and during her life, all the remainder of my estate goods and Chattles house-hold & kitchen furniture; stock of every kind together with the following Negroes, to wit, Tom, Jim, Daniel & Joe Jane, Esther, Letty, & Pender, these & singular the premises I give to my said wife, for and during her life, for ~~and during~~ her maintenance & support, and the maintenance and support of such of the children as may chuse to live with her, and at the death of my said wife, or as soon thereafter as may be, my Will is that all my estate of every kind as above enumerated and not disposed of be divided amongst my four youngest children, in such proportion as having ^{being} to the amount herein before given; the final and total amount of each child's portion shall be equal and of the same amount and if upon a final distribution the portion of the four youngest should amount severally to more than the portions of each of the eldest, then in that case, the two eldest will come in for an equal share of the remainders— And if it shall so happen that my sons bary and John, or either of them shall marry and not
