of the Universe to bless me do hereby make my last Will and
Testament in the manner and form following To wit: my Will

65 and desire is that the land I bought of John Bailey who was
duly authorized by Jameson's Heirs to sell the same, which
contains one hundred and thirty nine acres adjoining the land
I purchased of Benjamin Gresham should be sold after being
duly advertised on a Credit of eighteen months bond and
approved security to be taken of the purchaser or purchasers and a lien be
retained on said land till the money is paid, and that said money shall be
applied towards paying the eight hundred dollars which I owe for the
said land & if the land should not sell for enough to pay said money
that the balance shall be paid out out of any money or property belonging
to my estate at the discretion of those who manage the same, and that all
my just bills should be paid as soon as convenient, and that none of the
balance of my land hereafter mentioned or my slaves ~~it can be avoided~~
should be sold for that purpose if it can be avoided, and my wife and
desire further is that the tract of Land whereon I now reside purchased
of Benjamin Gresham containing one hundred and thirty eight acres
also the two acres on which the mill is situated that I purchased of the
same should be divided as follows that is to say that my dearly beloved
wife Mildred shall have and enjoy one third of said lands during her
life and that at her death the said one third part shall be equally
between my beloved children Frances Tugman and Eliza Willis Tugman
that my said children shall in addition have and possess the other
two thirds of said land; and that the residue of my estate consisting
of Negroes stock &c shall be divided between my said beloved wife
Mildred Tugman & my beloved children Frances Tugman & Eliza Willis
Tugman in the same manner that the land is to be, and I do hereby
appoint my dearly beloved wife Mildred Tugman executrix and my
trusty friends William Wells of Adams County & Tugman Craig of Gallatin
County Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby expressly
declaring and publishing this as my last Will and Testament that
all others made by me are hereby revoked & annulled, given under
my hand & seal this 20th of April 1820.

Item 6th. My Will and desire is, that all the rest of my Estate of every description be equally divided between all my children; Viz. Benjamin Dale, Nancy Shely, Hannah Shely, William Dale, John Dale, Melly Gore, Elizabeth Shely, Isaac Dale, Anne Dale, & Rosanna Dale, for them & their heirs jointly to enjoy the same forever.

I am, &c. I hereby constitute and appoint my son Reuben Dale
my friend Shaver Hardy executor of this my last Will & Testament
revoking all Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made and
do declare this to be my last Will & Testament given under my hand
and seal the 19th day of September 1816.
