 all my Stock of Hogs, hares, traps, Cattle all my
 beds and furniture and all my house hold and
 kitchen furniture of every nature and description
 whatever also all my Farming utensils of
 every nature, and description all for the life
 and support however of my Daughter Miranda
 I Smith during her Natural life 3rdly I do
 give and bequeath to my Daughter Miranda
 I Smith all the Corn wheat oats and Rye
 and all the Pork Bacon which may be on
 hand at my death and I do furthermore give
 unto her a Note which I hold on John Hudson
 for \$50. also a note which I hold on David
 Cook for \$50.00 also a note on James Hall
 for about the amount of \$50. also a note on
 William Linton for \$50.00 also all the benefit &
 interest I have in and to a judgment in the
 office of the Owen County Court for \$50.00 obtained
 against Samuel Hudson a debt of John Foster
 4thly I do give and bequeath to my said
 Daughter Miranda I Smith all the Rest and
 residue of my property of every nature and description
 whatever 5thly and in the last place I do ordain
 constitute and appoint my son John I Foster
 Executor of this my last will and Testament and
 it is my desire that he should not be held to give
 Security for his Executorship In testimony whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th
