of every description all which I sell to the negro plantation
as to be at her disposal at her death.
I give my son John McKim and my daughter Polly McKim
Polly McKim and the children of my deceased son William McKim
whose names I do not now recollect I give five shillings Sterling
each to my sons William McKim Thomas McKim and
Richard McKim and my daughter Nancy McKim Elizabeth
Marshall Sarah Sedew and my Grand son William McKim
son of Bully McKim I give and bequeath one hundred dollars
each to be paid out of the fund arising from the sale of my
negro man Peter and my negro boy Isaac and the balance
of my stock not otherwise disposed of by this will which
my wife and stock I direct to be sold at my account to my
beloved son Miles McKim and Lewis McKim as follows to wit
that I give a cow a year old and the advantage called spawdles
and the saddle and bridle he now owns all that part of my
plantation east of the spring I direct to be rented out and
the profits in repair for the support of my wife Lucy McKim
and to supply any contingency that may arise and at the
time of my death if my wife Lucy McKim is or becomes
the law as will be convenient I desire that she
