

Will of John Hutchins Decd.

March the 5th 1879

I John Hutchins this day doth have my will made. I want my farm the land where I now live rented out my wifes life time and the lower end of the farm so as to include all the land on the North side of the mountain that is cleared for Richard Hilton if he does any good if not I want it rented to all to go to the benefit of my wife. I also want my personal property after all my debts is settled my wife to have two young cows and five of my best Hogs and all the House Plunder also what shup there is. The rest of my property to be equally divided between the heirs.

My notes and accounts is as follows. One note on Jack Hoister of 1425- two notes on Thomas Grason one hundred dollars each, also account against Elijah H. Green for tax receipts from the year 1843- up to 1872 on three hundred acres of land. My Indebtedness is as follows, is six dollars to John Steel and Sarah Lawson also one dollar and eight cents to Elizabeth Morgan son to doctors. I want James Hutchins and Elijah Hutchins to attend to it for me.
