wife Winnefred Dickson during her life or Widowhood
one third part of my Stock of Cattle sheep hogs house
hold and kitchen furniture and one third part of my
present Crop of Corn, wheat, Rye, hem and flax, &
when ever she shall marry or depart this life my
will is that the whole of the property that I have
lent her shall revert to my estate and be equal-
ly divided between my five youngest Children
namely James Dickson, Richard Dickson, Betsy
Dickson, Julia Dickson, and William Dickson, to them
and their heirs forever, Item my Will and desire
is that two thirds of my Stock of Cattle sheep hogs house
hold ^{& kitchen} furniture, and two thirds of my present Crop
of Tobacco, Corn, Wheat, Rye, hem and flax
also my Waggon and gear, Wheelbarrow & plan-
tation tools shall be sold by my executors on
twelve months Credit taking bond & Security
and the money arising therefrom after
paying my just debts to be equally divided
between my five Children as aforesaid namely
James Dickson, Richard Dickson, Betsy Dickson
Julia Dickson and William Dickson to them
and their heirs forever, My desire is that if
my Death shall take place in any year after
the tenth of March, that the Crop in that
year shall be divided in the same man-

Person of the county of Boone and State of Kentucky
being in perfect health of body and of sound
mind, memory and understanding (being in God
for the same) but considering the uncertainty of
this transitory life do make and publish this my
last will and Testament, in manner and form follow-
ing to wit: Principally, and first of all, I do bequeath
my mortal soul into the hands of God who gave it
and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent
and Christian like manner at the direction of my
Executors herein after named, and as to such worldly
estate wherewith to thank and praise God to keep me in
this life. I give and dispose of the same in the
following manner to wit:

First I do my will and I do order that all my pre-
cious and funeral expenses be duly paid and
satisfied as soon as conveniently can be after my
decease; I give and bequeath to my dear wife
Hester Person her living estate, and a bed and
furniture besides her thirds allowed by law.

I give and bequeath to my brother Andrew Person
one bed and furniture, and to have his living out of
my estate during his natural life - I give and
bequeath to my grand daughters Lucretia and Hester
Person the sum of five dollars each, they having
already received, to the amount of ten hundred and
fifty to a dollar more than the rest of my heirs -

I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Cath-
arine Person one bed and furniture, and as touching
all the rest, residue and remainder of my Estate
of what kind or nature ever the same may be,
from and immediately after the death of my
wife Hester Person and my brother Andrew
Person I give and bequeath to my daughter
Neha Wiley one third part, to my grand daugh-
ter Catherine Person one third part, and to the
heirs of my daughter Polly Vickard one third part

And lastly I nominate, constitute and appoint my
dear wife Hester Person, Jacob Wiley and Hester
Vickard of the County of Campbell and State of Kentucky
to be the executors of this my last will hereby
revoking all other wills legacies and bequests by me
heretofore made and declaring this and no other,
to be my last will and Testament -
