In the name of God Amen I Alexander McPherson
of the County of Boone and State of Kentucky now in a low state of
health but sound in mind and not knowing how soon I shall be removed
may call me from time to time to eternity do make this my last will and
testament in the manner and form following: To wit first I commend
my soul to God who gave it, and my body I intend in a decent and
Christian like manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter to be
mentioned: as to what movable property goods I now possess

I will they be disposed of in the following manner (to wit)

1st It is my will that my just debts be paid and

2nd I give and bequeath unto my well and beloved wife Rebecca my
real and personal estate after paying all my just debts during
her natural life or while she remains my widow with the exception
herein after to be mentioned: If she should marry it is my will
she should have her bed room and a saddle. It is also my will that
the share of my daughter Ellenor McClure shall have forty dollars in
such property as may suit my beloved wife & further if my son
Charles should ever return that he shall have a bed and bedding
and if the said Charles should never return it is my will that
the property devoted to him be equally divided among the surviving
legates or heirs of my estate hereafter mentioned after the death of
my wife or when she ceases to be my widow. It is my will that the
balance of my estate be divided equally among my heirs

The Legates mentioned above to Ellenor to be faithfully paid
before a division takes place of the whole of my property. It is to be remembered
herein that the legacy above mentioned to Ellenor is an equal proportion with
what the rest have of the legates have received. My only heirs are the
heirs of my son Mark and Ellenor McClure Robert Elizabeth Ellen
Abraham Rebecca & Samuel. I will that my land be equally divided
among the said heirs. I will that my son Mark have more than
his proportion. The land falling to Elizabeth and Rebecca and the same
Ellenor their heirs lawfully begotten and their own heirs.

I do by these presents constitute and appoint my true and
trusty friend James Travis Esq. executor with my beloved wife
Rebecca I constitute this to be my last will and testament

I have Johnson for of Boone County being much reduced
in body but of sound mind and memory do make and Ordain this
writing as and for my last will and testament - In manner and
form following (to wit) I will and desire that my executors hereafter
to be named take into their possession the whole of my Estate both
real & personal of every description to collect all debts that may be
collected sell any part of my personal Estate that they may think necessary
and from the proceeds thereof to pay and discharge all my just debts
and funeral expenses and whatsoever of my said Estate remaining after
the discharge of my debts as aforesaid to be held managed used by my
Executors to the best advantage according to their judgment for the benefit
of my beloved wife Lucy and for the raising and support of my children until
the youngest one of them shall attain to the age of fourteen years at which time
all my personal Estate then remaining to be divided into three equal parts

said children - and as to my real Estate I will that also be equally divided
