home to join the North Western army
in the Company of Capt. William Storer
and that he wanted to them that in case
he should not return that all his property both

the use and benefit of his wife Elizabeth Beckwith
and that he appeared to be wise when he stated
to them that it was his wish and intention
that in case of his death that his wife should have
all his property he having no children. And that
he has not returned but as they believe on the
