We Edm. J. Vawter and Willis Redden two of the Commissioners
appointed by the County Court of Boone to settle the accounts of Exor
Guardians &c. under and in pursuance of the act of the Legislature
of Kentucky approved 24th February 1834. Have this day proceeded
to State and settle with Ch. Chambliss all the accounts &c. of his acts
and doings as Executor of Lewis Redden dec'd and do find and
report the same as follows To wit:
That the said Ch. Chambliss as Exr as afo. has collected all the
debts due said Estate which were or are concerned with attempt-
ing to collect and that he as Exr as afo. has paid out in the
payment of debts due from the said L. Redden dec'd in the
support and maintenance of S. A. Redden's family, education
of his children and in portions or legacies to the married children
of said decedent the sum of nine thousand two hundred &

 named, and making proper bills of sale to each Heir for the share
 named, and by their presents are each hereby relinquished to the
 other all claims to the slaves, names respectively and set off &
 paid to the parties named. We further agree among ourselves
 that the said servants Thomas and Sarah his wife shall manumit
 of their as long and faithful service he set at liberty and
 be forever free from further servitude.
