In the name of God amen I, Andrew Hughe
of Boone County and Commonwealth of Kentucky
being weak of body, but of sound mind therefore
thank be to almighty God, and calling to mind the
frailties of human nature & knowing that it is
appertained for all men once to die, do make consti-
tute and appoint this my last will & testament
revising and making void all wills or forms of will
herefore by me made; declaring this only this
to be my last will and testament in manner and
form following -

Imprimis. I recommend my soul into the hands
of almighty God; who gave it, hoping that
through the merits of his beloved son Jesus
Christ to meet a joyful resurrection at the
last day & that even temporal estate
it hath pleased almighty God to bestow me
with. Desire may be appased as follows:
First I recommend by will to my mother
earth at the discretion of my executors
hereafter mentioned.

Item. I
give and bequeath to my beloved wife
Anne Hanes during her life the manor
plantation wherein she now lives containing
one hundred and twenty acres, also her choice
of two of my Horses or mares now in my
possession. two cows and calves. half of my
stock of sheep. all my stock of hogs &
geese two feather beds and furniture
also my kitchen furniture & farming
utensils -

Item. I
give and bequeath to my daughter
Eliza Hanes. John Hanes. Henrich Hanes &
Isomony Hanes an equal fourth part
each of all my estate notwithstanding

bequeathed to be given to them as they come of
full age, that the division be made by my
executors in the most convenient way that he or
she may think most proper so that the same be
as equally divided as the nature of the case may be

Item. It is my will & desire that the whole of
my estate which I have given to my wife
may be equally divided between my said
four children, to wit, Eliza. John. Henrich &
Isomony at the death of my said wife.

Item. Whatever estate I have heretofore given to my
son James Hanes & Margaret Paisie &
now deceased. them with the additional
sum of One Dollar each in free of my
estate -

Item. Lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my
two Brothers in law Moses & John Masterson
executors of this my last will & testament
in witness whereof I do hereby set my hand
& cause my seal this fifth day of August
Eighteen hundred and twelve -
