heretofore by me made, declaring this solely to
be my last will and testament in manner and
form following -

Impressum. I recommend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God: who gave it, hoping that
through the merits of his blessed son Jesus
Christ to meet a joyful resurrection at the
last day & that with temporal estate
it hath pleased Almighty God to keep me
with. I desire may be disposed of as follows:
first I recommend by body to is mother
earth at the discretion of my executors
hereafter mentioned.

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
Ann Hughes during her life the mention
plantation wherein she now lives containing
one hundred and twenty acres, also her share
of two of my Horses or mares now in my
possession, two cows and calves, half of my
stock of sheep, all my stock of Hogs &
geese two feather beds and furniture
also my kitchen furniture & Farming
implements -

I give and bequeath to my daughter
Eliza Hews, John Hews, Muriah Hews &
Isamny Hews an equal fourth part
each of all my estate not heretofore

bequeathed to be given to them as they come of
full age, that the division be made by my
executors in the most convenient way that be or
she may think most proper so that the same be
as equally divided as the nature of the case may be

Item - It is my will & desire that the whole of
my estate which I have given to my wife
may be equally divided between my said
four children, to wit, Eliza, John, Hugh &
Isamny at the death of my said wife.

Item - Whatever estate I have heretofore given to my
son James Hews & Margaret Paul I
now bequeath them with the additional
sum of One Dollar each in full of my
estate -

Item - Lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my
beloved Brothers in Law Moses & John Masters
executors of this my last will & testament
in Kentucky whereof I do hereby set my hand
& cause my seal this fifth day of August
