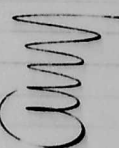

3.^d As it regards the land I leave on my wish is for it when given up by wife to descend to and be equally divided between my children to wit, Willis Graves, Polly Cove, and Betsey Graves and to their heirs and assigns forever upon the condition that they equally join and pay up to all the children of my daughter Nancy a sum to be equally divided among them that will make the tract of land which I lately conveyed to Oliver, John & Elizabeth Cove equal in value to the parts they respectively receive.

4.th It is my wish that the property heretofore advanced by me to my children respectively be taken into consideration and they placed upon an equality, and then the balance of the proceeds of the sales of the personal property and collections after making them all equal to be equally divided among them under the regulations aforesaid in the latter part of the 3.^d article in this will.

Lastly I appoint my son Willis Graves & son in law Abner Graves Executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others and declaring this to be my only last will and testament. In the name of God. Amen. I, Schibad Huston of the County of Boone and State of Ky. being sick and in a low Condition put in perfect mind and memory. Do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following to wit. First, I desire that all my Just debts should be paid, secondly that my estate shall be equally divided between all my children with an addition of two hundred dollars extraordinary to my daughter Louisa Huston in consideration of her lameness, I desire that One hundred dollars may be given to each or any of my children as they become of age or marry, if in the opinion of my wife Elizabeth Huston it shall be considered by her proper to do so. A regular account of which to be kept by my Executors so as to keep up the equalising principal as stated above. It is furthermore my wish that my son David Huston should convey and use his discretion and opinion in this last mentioned case, together with his mother.

It is my desire that my Executors or either of them shall be fully empowered to make and receive deeds to any land according to any contract heretofore made by me at their discretion.

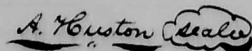
As to the best of my recollection my two eldest sons David and James have received about twenty five dollars each out of my Estate. It is my desire that this amount be first charged to them as a part of their portion, respectively.

It is my desire that if my Executors together with such of my children as shall be grown - shall at any time think it well redound to their interests and advantage to see the tract of land whereon I now live, that they shall be fully empowered to do so, the money arising to be appropriated by my Executors to the purchase of other land or applied to the common benefit of the family at their discretion. And they or either of them are hereby empowered to make a conveyance or conveyances for the same.

I do appoint and constitute my wife Elizabeth Huston & my son David Huston, my Executors and Executor to this my last will and testament
