Boone and State of Kentucky being in health and of perfect mind
and memory but being advanced in years and calling to mind Approach-

children Benjamin Neal & Sarah Shackelford - Also I give & bequeath to my son
William Neal the sum of Five Dollars to be paid out of my personal Estate

To my son William Neal I give and bequeath the tract of land on which
he now resides containing fifty five acres and twenty two perches of which he has
a plat laid off by Moses Scott Decr 15th 1817

Also to my son Thomas Neal I give and bequeath the tract of land whereon
he now resides containing about seventy acres more or less - as surveyed and laid off
by Moses Scott on the date above a plat of which has been given him -

Also I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Hodgson the tract of land on
which she now resides containing about seventy acres more or less as
surveyed & laid off by Moses Scott on the date above during her natural life
and then to her children the heirs of her body - And moreover I do hereby
nominate constitute and appoint my son William Neal sole Executor of
this my last will and Testament - In Testimony Whereof I have
