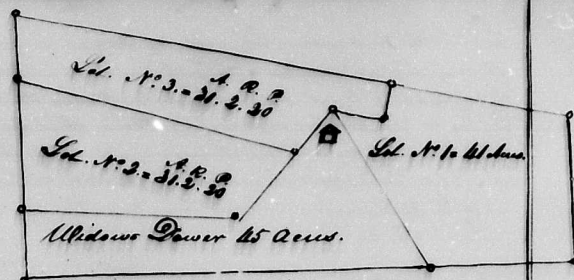

In conformity to an order of Boone County Court December Term 1835. I allot and set apart the dower of Rebecca Recus in the lands of Joel Recus dec'd and also to make division among the heirs of said deceased, on the 14<sup>th</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup> 1835 I surveyed for the widow and heirs afo<sup>r</sup> 18 3/4 acres of land on the waters of Woodcock Creek, Beginning at two beech trees in a line of Early & Walker corner of Cave Close thence south his line 66<sup>th</sup> M. 132 poles to a beech tree and stump corner of W. Jenkins thence south his line and passing his corner 178 E. 253 poles to a beech tree corner of Joshua Recus thence south his line 178 E. 67 poles to two beech trees corner of said Recus in a line of Early and Walker thence south his line 177 M. 358 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Rebecca Recus widow and relict of Joel Recus dec'd 45 acres of land assigned to her as her dower for the above described tract of 18 3/4 acres Beginning at a stake corner of Lot N. 1. and thence north N. 3. 249 M. 70 poles to a stake corner of Lot N. 2. thence with a line thence of 178 M. 97 poles to two beech trees in Cave Close line thence south 178 M. 30 poles to a beech tree & beech stump corner of W.
