

Boone County Lot

In conformity to an order of Boone County Court December Term 1835. to allot and set apart the shares of Justice Powers in the lands of said House Geo. and also to make division among the heirs of said deceased, on the 14th Dec. 1835 Surveyed for the widow and heirs afo' 16 1/2 acres of land on the waters of Wappapello Creek, Beginning at two bush trees in a line of Early & Walker, corner of Clegg's line then with his line N. 16. 1/2 poles to a bush tree and stump corner of W. Jenkins then with his line and passing his corner S. 16. E. 25 1/2 poles to a bush tree corner of Jenkins Powers then with his line N. E. 16 poles to two bush trees corner of said Powers in a line of Early and Walker then with said line S. 16. W. 35 1/2 poles to the beginning.

Surveyed for Justice Powers widow and widow of said Powers afo' 16 1/2 acres of land aforesaid to her as her dower in the above described tract of 16 1/2 acres. Beginning at a stake corner of Lot N. 1. and Clegg then with N. 3. S. 16. W. 70 poles to a stake corner of Lot N. 3. then with a line thence N. 16.
