This Settlement made by the Commissions with Lorenzo D. Ferguson and Lucy A. Ferguson Executors of the Estate of Isaac Johnson Sr. was this day recorded, whereupon the same is duly recorded.

Mr. James Hamilton, Thomas Alston, Thomas and Machie Conn. Agents of the Estate of Willis Kraus Dec. who was in his lifetime Guardian of the Heirs of R. Cane's Heir. Pick. Cane Dec. in conjunction with S. H. Harts this 30th day of June 1835. called upon us the undersigned Commissions to take and settle accounts for the purpose of adjusting and settling the accounts of Willis Kraus Guardian as aforesaid and we having examined the vouchers both for and against S. H. Harts report that he balanced his accounts with the heirs and stood true by a settlement with the County Court of Room at their January Term 1830.

We now find that on the 1st of January 1835. there was in the hands of the representatives of said Guardian \$468.88. as appears by voluntary files in 1830. the interest thereon since 1st Jan 1830. was \$140.70. making an amount of \$608.58.

We also find that with the consent of his wards and to prevent the entire loss the S. H. Guardian sold a Negro Man by the name of Walker for \$273. after deducting expenses the interest thereon from the 1st Jan 1830. to 1st Jan 1835. was \$111.60. making an amount of \$461.60. which added to the foregoing amount of \$608.58 makes an aggregate of \$1072.54.

We further find that said Guardian on the 1st of Jan 1832. had received for the rent of the farm \$80. also for the hire of a Negro man George up to the same time \$140. which added to the rent makes \$320. this added to the \$1072.54 does as and 54 cents made the amount of \$1312.54.

We then allowed to Benja. Rogers who intermarried with Olivia Bane in Sept. 1831. One of the wards, One third of that amount which was \$437.51.

We then charged him with the amount which the Guardian had advanced to him and his wife as well as appear by vouchers hereunto taken and filed, which leaves the S. Rogers indebted to the Estate of said Guardian.

We further report that John Kitley intermarried with Elizabeth Bane another Heir in the year 1834 and that we allowed him.

his one third part of the principal and for the hire of the Blackman George up to Jan 1st 1835.

As it appears that a division of the slaves took place in the Spring 1832. and George was set apart to his wife Elizabeth and in addition we allowed him \$0.00.

his third part of the rent up to Jan 1st 1835. making the aggregate amount in the S. Kitley's favor of \$690.00.

Which amount we credited by \$589.07 which still left a balance in S. Kitley's favor of \$100.93.

All of which we appear by vouchers hereunto taken and filed. We further report that we allowed John Bane his one third part of the \$1312.54 etc making \$437.51.

also \$40.00 to his one third part of the rent from 1st Jan 1832. up to 1st Jan 1835. he having from that time had the slaves set apart to him which left the estate of his Guardian his debt of \$477.51.

which we have credited by \$332.13 leaving a balance still due the S. John Bane of \$145.38.

All of which is evidenced by vouchers hereunto taken and filed. We lastly report that there parties were present.

Since the above Settlement the above produce two additional vouchers from C. F. Hawster, against S. Kitley and wife marked 12415. which are allowed making the amount of \$21.93 that taken from \$145.38 leaves a final balance in Kitley's favor of \$123.45.
