In the name of God Amen, I Jenniah Kitley of the County of Boone and State of Kentucky being in sound mind and disposing memory (for which I thank God) but calling to mind the uncertainty of life and being desirous to dispose of such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and bequeath the same in manner following: Viz. I leave to my dear & beloved Wife Mary Kitley during her natural life the whole of the two tracts of land the one whereon I now live which I purchased of Harry Walker, and the other that which I purchased of Henry Coons, with such parts of them that shall hereinafter be given to Robert Kitley and Permelia Sanford, Also my Horse mill land all the appertinances and Improvements unto the said land belonging likewise my road Wagon and gear. Also I leave to my beloved Wife Mary Kitley during her natural life eleven of my negroes namely Ned, Nanny, Rippon, Willy, Fanny, Evers, Silvery, Ben, Pat, Lewis and Peter and their issue
