

County Court December Term 1817 we
the undersigned commissioners have power
to lay off the dower to the widow of Elijah
Rice dec^d as follows (viz) one third of the
negro woman Charlotte to be enjoyed by the
successor or heir of s^r negro one third in each
and one hundred and nineteen dollars out
of the money arising from the sales being one
third part of the sales money and also sixty five
and one half acres of land being one third
part in quantity & quality of said tract of
land belonging to the estate of the afo^d Rice
which third includes the Mansion House
the field notes of the whole survey is as fol
lows (viz) Beginning at a small buck
corner to Henry Duper and Ogallie thence 135 w
268 pds two buck corner to Joshua Whittington
thence 1787 G 190 pd to an elm & buck thence
