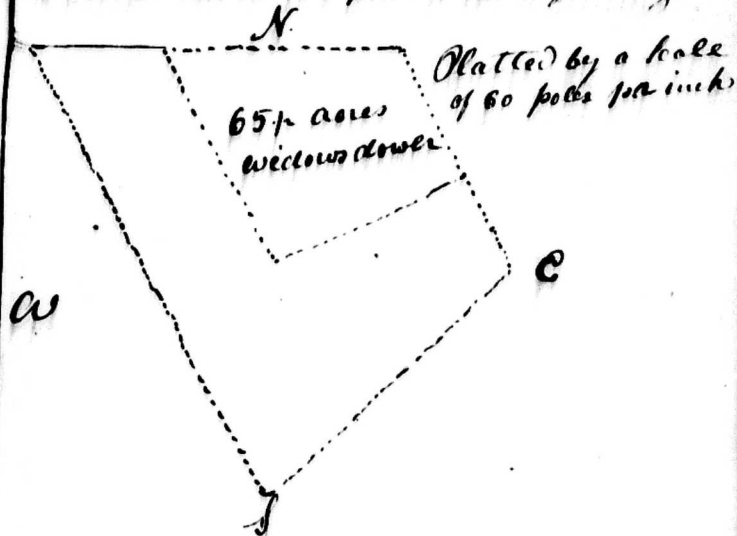

County Court December Term 1817 we
the undersigned commissioners have proceeded
to lay off the dower to the widow of Elijah
Rice dec'd as follows (viz) one third of the
negro woman Charlotte to be enjoyed by the
widow or hire of s^d negro one third in cash
and one hundred and nineteen dollars out
of the money arising from the sales being one
third part of the sales money and also sixty five
and one half acres of land being one third
part in quantity & quality of said tract of
land belonging to the estate of the ap^d Rice
which third includes the Mansion House
the field notes of the whole survey is as fol
lows (viz) Beginning at a small beech
corner to Henry Defer and Ezekiel Thome N 81° W
263 pds to two beech corner to Ashua Whittington
Thome N 87° E 190 pds to an elm and beech thome
S 31° E 130 pds to two beech & a black oak corner to
Ezekiel Rice ap^d thome with his line S 42° E 186
poles to the beginning — The dower is as fol
lows Beginning at an elm & beech thome
