

I, Garnett Mitchell of the County of Boone and State of Kentucky, being desirous to direct in what manner the property, I now have shall be disposed of after my death to make and to have this my last will and testament in manner following to wit:

1. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Rebecca Mitchell during her widowhood all my personal property that is to say one mare & colt two horses two beds and the furniture thereof belonging one press and cupboard and one table and kitchen furniture one chair, one wheel and looking glass but my desire is that my Executor to be hereafter named shall in case my wife as aforesaid shall marry any other man either and in that case my Executor shall sell to the highest bidder on credit the following property as named up (to wit) one mare & colt two horses two beds one wheel looking glass table kitchen furniture & one of the sheep provided the other is living and the money arising from such sale to be put on interest for the benefit of my daughter Malinda Mitchell.

2. Whereas I have about the amount of forty dollars in cash and notes my desire is that my Executor as aforesaid after paying my just debts and funeral expenses out of the aforesaid cash proceed to collect those notes and loan the money out at interest for the use and benefit of my daughter as aforesaid to her and her heirs and assigns forever.

3. I constitute and appoint my Father Benjamin Mitchell Executor of this my last will and testament.

Pursuant to an order of the Boone
County Court we Churchill Gaines Lewis Wells and
Mills Graves have this 10 day of Sept 1827. Proceeded to
make a division of the slaves belonging to the estate
of Mr. Rogers Deed among the Heirs of said Deed and
to allot each heir their proportion in the first place
we estimated the value of the slaves to be as follows
To wit

One woman named Charlotte	at	\$400.00
One man " do John "	at	400.00
One woman " do Sally "	at	325.00
One boy " do Jack "	at	40.00
One girl " do Kitty "	at	275.00
One boy " do George "	at	275.00
One boy " do Gabriel	-	225.00
One girl " do Lem	-	200.00
One do do Sam	-	150.00
One boy do Sam	-	130.00
One girl and child named Louisa	-	160.00

Secondly, agreeable to another order of said court
we proceeded to allot and assign to Sarah Rogers, widow
of said Deed her dower out of the above slaves and accord-
ingly assigned to her said woman named Charlotte
and the negro man John valued at \$400. — \$400.00

Which she agreed to receive as her dower under the executa-
tion that she had received more than one third part of
the personal property of her said Deed husband. The particu-
lar state of which we upon examination find to be as follows To wit
that the Admrs sold a property which out slaves to the
amount of three hundred and a fifty seven dollars
09 3/4 cents and that the widow recd at the appraised
value \$279.9800 worth of property.

We further proceed to make a division of the remain-
ing slaves of said Deed among the Heirs, and valued
each slave which we done and do also report it as follo-
wing to wit. There being but nine slaves and three Heirs
we so arranged it, that the two most valuable slaves were
each to be given by two Heirs. The names and estimated
value of the slaves are as follows —

Jack - a boy valued at	\$400.00
Sally a girl valued at	325.00
Kitty a girl valued at	275.00
