

In the name of God amen, Edmund Garnett of the County of Boone and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory, but knowing the uncertainty of life, desire to dispose of such estate with which it has been pleased God to bless me, do make constitute and Ordain this my last will and testament in manner following (to wit.)

First. My will is that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid.

Edmund Garnett. Secondly. I give and bequeath to my son John Station Garnett all that part of the tract of land, with the appurtenances thereto belonging whereon I now live lying and being on the north side of the road leading from Butteltsburgh meetinghouse to the Ohio River at North Bend to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Thirdly. I give and bequeath to my daughter Fanny James all that tract of land I purchased of John Morris lying in the County of Boone and State afo^e on the water of Garrison Run containing about One hundred and seventeen acres to her and her heirs and assigns forever.

Fourthly. My will and desire is that the balance of the tract of land whereon I now live as lying on the south side of the road as named aforesaid in the 2nd item of this will including the tract purchased of Thomas Whitaker be sold by my Executors (hereafter to be named) at a reasonable credit & the money arising from such sale to be equally divided amongst my children as follows, Joel Garnett, James Garnett, Elizabeth Garnett, Polly Ingraham, Susanna, Fannie, James, John Station Garnett, and my Grand daughter Elizabeth Willis to them and their heirs forever.

Fifthly. My will and desire is that all my stock of Horses Cattle sheep, hogs &c. household and kitchen furniture, farming tools and all other property of every description belonging to my estate (not otherwise here devised, shall be sold to the highest bidder at a reasonable credit and the money arising from such sale to be divided amongst my children as before named.

Sixthly. My will is that my executors shall expose to sale as afo^e at a reasonable credit all of my stores amongst my legates (as I do not wish them sold out of the family) and the money arising therefrom to be divided as afo^e.

Seventhly. My will and desire is that should any of my children as named as afo^e die without issue or offspring lawfully begotten of their body then and in that case I will the estate bequeathed them by this will to revert back as part of my estate to be equally divided amongst the residue of my children as aforesaid.

Whereas I have a book wherein I have charged each one of my children with the price I have put on such property as I have let them have in advance in order to enable me to give them as near equal as possible. Therefore I wish my Executors in making distribution of my estate amongst my legates to make all equal (before any other distribution is made) agree able as they in said book shall stand charged.

Eighthly. My wish is that such of my estate as will fall to my Grand daughter Elizabeth Willis, my Executors shall retain in their own hands until she should marry or become of age.

Tenthly. I do hereby appoint my son Joel Garnett and my son in law William Garnett Executors of this my last will and testament.

The Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fifth day of October 1834.

In the name of God amen. George Kile of the County of Boone and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and disposing memory, but weak of body and being aware that I must shortly go the way of all the earth, do make Ordain and publish this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and declaring all other will or wills or testaments by me made or attempted to be made null and void and establishing this as my only true last will and Testament, and first it is my wish and desire that after my decease my body should be buried in a decent & orderly manner such as becomes the solemnity of such an Occasion on my farm near where my wife is buried.

Second it is my wish and desire that all my just debts shall be paid as soon after my decease as may be convenient.

Third I will and bequeath to my son William Kile all my landed estate in Boone County Kentucky also the home for a year

deed for said land being the land whereon Mr. Daniel now lives
I also give and bequeath to my said son one room now in
the possession of said William Daniel, together with all my beds
bedding household and kitchen furniture together with all my
estate of every kind and description to him the said William
Kite and his heirs forever.

Fourth I will and bequeath to my son John Kite all my pewter
ware to him and his heirs forever.

Fifth I will and bequeath to my son George Kite One dollar to
him and his heirs forever to be paid him by my Executors here
in after to be named.

Sixth I will and bequeath to the heirs of my daughter Polly
Here One dollar to be paid them by my Executors, my said
son John and son George and daughter Polly having hitherto
received more estate from me than my son William & my
wish that after they the said John George, and Polly heirs re-
ceive the bequests herein before given them that my son
William shall have all the balance of my estate of every
kind and description.

Seventh whereas I have always wished that my slaves should
be free at my death, I do hereby will and bequeath order &
direct that my slaves, named Sam Joseph, Hannah, Samuel
Acelfhia, Eliza, & Mary Catharine, shall be free at my de-
cease and I do hereby order and direct that they be released
and discharged from all servitude and bondage to my
heirs and other persons.

Eighth I hereby nominate and appoint my son William
Kite sole Executor of this my last will and Testament
and do hereby declare it my wish that said William
Kite may administer upon my estate and execute this my will
without being required to give bond or security. In witness
whereof I do hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day
of March 1826.
