 of the County of Boone and State of Kentucky
 being of sound mind and disposing memory and
 calling to mind the uncertainty of human life
 and being desirous to dispose of all such things
 which I do hereby give and bequeath the same in
 manner following (To wit)

1st To my dear wife Sally Craig I give in fee
 simple forever all my personal estate &
 all my Slaves (except my negro man Sam)
 during her natural life, & it is my desire
 that at my death my said Negro man Sam
 should be free and at the death of my said
 wife, the balance of my Slaves should also
 be free.

2nd It is my will and desire that my real
 Estate should be the fund out of which all
 my just debts should be paid; To this end
 I hereby devise to my executors herein
 after mentioned all my real Estate in
 fee in trust to sell the same or part thereof
 for the payment of my said debts, and
 divide the residue (if any there be)
 in manner herein after mentioned
 my executors will exercise their discretion
 in selecting such parts of my real
 Estate for sale for the way that fit
 having regard the general and best
 interest of all the devisees and may
 sell at publick or private sale, on prompt
 payment or on bond with such security
 as they may approve and judge
 most advantageous to all concerned
 so far as may be consistent with
 the laws of the country and the
 right of creditors
