Thirdly It is my will & desire that my executor hereafter named shall have the liberty & privilege of selling and conveying the whole of my real estate or any part of it as well as my negroes or any of them either at public or private sale as they may think best and then and there to put the money out at interest or purchase other land or negroes with it for the benefit of my estate as they in their judgment may think best being careful however to have all debts due my estate to be well secured and to keep a particular account of all their sales loans purchases incomes and expenditures of my kind

Fourthly It is my wish that my son Edwin should be well educated and well raised and that such sums of money out of my estate should be expended for those purposes as may be considered necessary & prudent by my executor. I declare that my beloved wife should in like manner have a gentle and comfortable support out of it during her life & then for my son Edwin to have all that is hereby given or bequeathed to him

Fifthly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my beloved wife Polly Gaines & my brother in law Paschal Hughes executor & co-executors of this my last will & Testament

Jacob Latimer of Boone County Kentucky being weak and feeble in body though of sound mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to make a disposition of my Estate by will do therefore make ordain and constitute this to be my last will and Testament

In the first place my wish and desire is that all my debts be paid as soon as the nature of the case and circumstances may permit

Secondly I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Jane Latimer my negro man named Tom and my negro girl named

names Sarah, and the future increase of said Sarah if any, also a good riding horse and saddle and bridle, and two good feather beds, &c. &c. and furniture, and such other articles of household furniture or personal property as she may choose to take, which are to be delivered by herself, and also two hundred dollars in cash, all of which I leave to her, and she is to have use and enjoy during her natural life and then all that remains of it is to be equally divided between my children Nancy Latimer and Richard J. Latimer.

Thirdly, I will and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Latimer & Pansell Latimer her husband the negro girl Harriet and the negro boy Moses, who are now in their possession, also my negro man Edmund and give him hundred dollars in cash to be paid them within three years after my decease, and no charge is to be made against them by my Executors or in any division of my Estate for the negroes Harriet and Moses I have hitherto given them and by them sold and for the horses or other personal property and a money heretofore given them.

Fourthly, I will and bequeath to my son Richard J. Latimer the farm and tract of land whereon I now live containing about two hundred and sixty three acres be the same more or less, with its appurtenances, also my negro slaves Evaline Samford & Robinson and two good horses and two good beds, bedsteads and furniture.

Fifthly, In case my negro boy Alfred is obtained in the law suit about him with Wm. H. Marshall, it is my will that my son Richard shall have said boy Alfred, but he is to have said boy by paying to my daughter Nancy and her said husband one hundred dollars.

Sixthly, It is my will and desire that all the balance or remainder of my Estate be it real personal or mixed & be it more or less, be it in possession or remainder, shall be equally divided and descend equally to my daughter Nancy & my son Richard J. Latimer.

Lastly, I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my son Richard J. Latimer, Executor to this my last will and testament.

Riddle jointly and to the survivors or survivor of them should either or any of them die without issue and under lawful age, the sum of twenty three hundred dollars to them and the heirs of either of them should former an equal portion of said sum of twenty three hundred dollars to be paid to each of said three children as he or she shall arrive at lawful age or marry, until which time said sum of twenty three hundred dollars is to remain in the hands and under the direction and control of my Executors herein after named, and in the event of the death of all three of my sister Ann's said children without leaving issue of their bodies I will and direct that said sum of twenty three hundred dollars shall go to my three brothers Charles Joseph & Alfred & their heirs forever.
