1st Should I die before my beloved wife Anna House it is my will and desire that she shall have during her natural life one third part of my personal and all of the estate we and also she is to have two of my slaves such as she may choose from year to year, and I promise that part of the tract of Land upon which I now live which is included in the following boundaries: Beginning at the corner of my land which comes with the line of said Frederick Zimmerman thence with said line to Deane House land thence with this line to Frederick Zimmerman's line thence with this line to Susan House land then with this line to where his gate now stands the with the land which "runs from said Gate to my house as far as to the cross fence near the mill then Eastwardly with said cross fence to the road then a straight line continued through the road to the line of Jervis Comer or T. Sumner thence with said Sumner line to the place of Beginning all of which with the profits and emoluments she is to use and enjoy at her pleasure during her natural life

2nd It is my will that the residue of my land be rented out by my Executors every year as long as my said wife may live and also that my Executors live but all such of my slaves as may not be in the service of my said wife as aforesaid then every year as long as my said wife may live the hiring of my said slaves however is to be limited among among my children no other persons are to hire them and the money arising from the rent of said land share of said slaves to be equally divided among all my children the child or children of any of my children who may be dead are to receive the portion of their dead Father or Mother equally; all of which is to be paid over accordingly as soon as it can be collected

3rd It is my will and desire that after the death of my said wife that my Executors sell to the highest bidder the whole of my Land

power of any man to dispose of the six hundred dollars which each of my step daughters Elizabeth & Mary E. Barnett is to receive from my estate. I give unto my beloved wife and all the residue and balance of my estate I give unto my beloved wife to dispose of as she may wish to do. For which said sum of \$4211.92 we concede said chambers as Ex^r as off^r is entitled to a credit we also have ascertained and do accordingly report that negro woman Kate of the estate of said L. Riddick died of Cholera in the month of Oct. 1832. and that negro man Charles another of S. L. Riddick's slaves was given up to John Riddick one of said Riddick's children on her marriage with Tho^s Stephens at the price of \$500 as at much towards her legacy of 500 So^s under the will of said L. Riddick said negro boy Charles was given up to said Stephens 18th March 1831. The said sum of 500 dollars is included in the above \$4211.92 cents expenditures and we have not taken into consideration any allowance or commission to said Chambers for his services as Ex^r and as co executor and Guardian of said estate of said L. Riddick.
