In the name of God Amen, I James Burns of the County of Boone State of Kentucky feeling my feeble and infirm bed in my right mind well resign my body to the dust and my soul to God who gave it I will to Thomas Burns my eldest son One dollar, Margaret Apple my next eldest child one dollar, Elizabeth Burns my next eldest child one dollar, Samuel Burns my next eldest child one dollar, David Burns my next eldest child one dollar, Polly Webster the wife of Benjn Webster my affectionate daughter. To her I will one barrel horse four years old against the 15th day of April next with a bag, saw his life hind foot white to his pastern joint, one saddle and bridle and saddle bags, one bed and bedstead and clothing. The reason I James Burns give this to my daughter is because she has had a great deal of trouble with me and my Companion her mother.

To Nancy Brints my daughter, one bureau and one cow, and five hogs of sheep and one light yellow gallop Helle and one dollar.

Every Burns my son one dollar.

William Burns my son one dollar.

Witness my hand and seal this the 14th day of January 1834.

Item, It is my will that my Executors dispose of my land when or I now live and my stock and household furniture to at my death on a credit of one year for the purpose of paying my debts of any and the remainder of the said money shall be equally divided between my several children as hereafter named to wit: Heskiah Ashley, Hannah Cloud, Sally Perkins, Leah Moss, Peggy Ann Perkins, James Cloud, Betsy Cloud, and the children of my son Daniel Cloud. Each of them shall be entitled to his share or one eighth of said sale money, to them and their heirs forever, and it is my will that my son William Cloud shall be entitled to the sum of ten dollars only.

Lastly, I constitute and appoint William Cloud, Sally Perkins, and Peggy Ann Perkins my Executors of this my last will and Testament.
