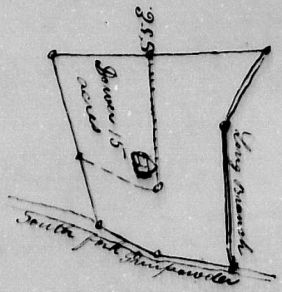

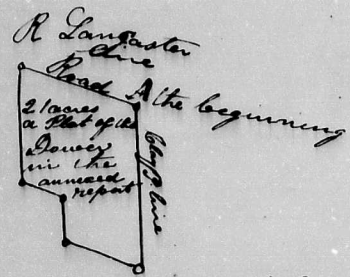


The Conformity to an order of Boone County Court

 of Hannah Delph late Widow and Relict of Samuel Weaver
 dec^d in the Tract of land whereon said Weaver Resided at his
 death. We the undersigned being first duly sworn do Report
 the lands of S^d Dec^d

Consisted of a Tract of Fifty acres whereon the said Hannah Delph
 now lives and that we did assign to her as her dower fifteen
 acres of the afo^d Tract of Fifty acres including the dwelling
 house and Orchard and other out buildings - The boundary
 of which is as follows To wit
 Beginning at a Cherry tree near the North West corner of the
 Orchard thence with the Orchard fence S 78 E. 43 1/2 poles to a
 stake in a line of Absalom Utty thence with it S 80 E 30 poles

Pursuant to an order of the Boone Ct Court appointing us upon the
 Motion of Rachael Lancaster late Widow of James Lancaster deceased
 to allot and lay off her Dower in the lands belonging to the Estate
 of S^d deceased that after being duly sworn according to law proceeded
 to lay off and set apart the one third part of seventy two acres.
 (The same appearing to be all the lands belonging to the Estate
 of S^d deceased) which one third part was set apart according to
 quantity and quality containing twenty one acres and bounded
 as follows (To wit) Beginning at a stake in the line of J.
 Coley and one of the corner of the afo^d seventy two acres

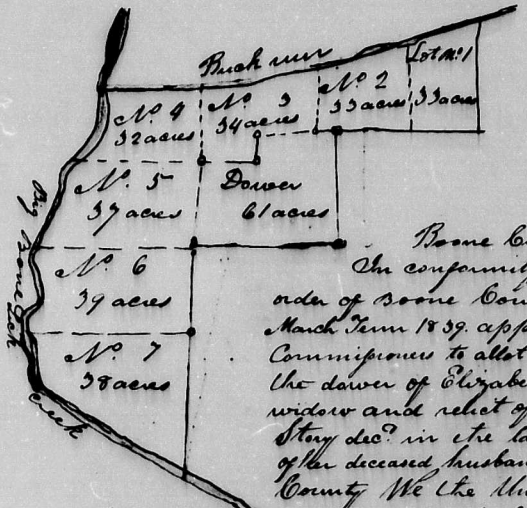

In conformity to an order of Boone County Court March Term 1839, appointing us Commissioners to allot and set apart the dower of Elizabeth Story widow and relict of Thomas P. Story dec^d in the land and dower of her deceased husband in Boone County We the Undersigned

Commissioners being just duly sworn do report that as far as came to our knowledge the lands of said dec^d consisted of a tract of 307 acres of land on Big Bone Lick Creek in the vicinity of the Big Bone Licks and that we did assign to said widow her dower 61 acres of the afo^d tract including the dwelling house and a reasonable portion of the wood lands the boundary of which is herewith annexed.

We also further report that the slaves of said dec^d as far as came to our knowledge consisted of a negro woman and four children the value of each one respectively is as follows To wit

We also further report that we did assign to the afo^d Elizabeth Story as her dower in and to the above named slaves the afo^d negro woman Fanny being as we conceive one equal third in value Given from under our hands as commissioners afo^d this 3^d day of April 1839.

In conformity to an order of Boone County Court March Term 1839 appointing us Commissioners to divide the lands of Thomas P. Story dec^d among the heirs of said dec^d We the undersigned being just duly sworn do report that the lands of said dec^d in Boone County as far as came to our knowledge consisted of a tract of 307 acres of land in the vicinity of Big Bone Licks the balance after assigning 61 acres to the widow as her dower we divided into seven lots among the heirs as hereafter reported We also assigned to Johnson Story one of the heirs 32 acres in a separate tract of land on which said Johnson now lives as his equal portion of the lands of said dec^d - We further report that the lots as we conceive are equal in value and were allotted as follows To wit -
