We the undersigned Commissioners appointed by an order of the County Court, of Boone County at their February Term 1832. To wit: John Reekers Son of the Estate of William Reekers dec^d the agent of said William Reekers dec^d as adm^r of James M^c Carty dec^d report as follows to wit: We find the papers and receipts all taken to Elizabeth M^c Carty adm^r of the Estate of James M^c Carty dec^d except three notes on Wm Davis as a part of the purchase money for the land sold by Wm Reekers as Commissioner under a decree of the Boone Circuit Court, which notes calling for three hundred and forty seven dollars and twelve cents principal has been deliv^d over to Elmore Scott as Guardian to the infant heirs of James M^c Carty dec^d in addition to which sum of \$347 1/2 cents

John Reekers while said notes were in his hands collected \$91.00 which is still in his hands making in the whole \$368.12 principal we also find that John Reekers holds a note on James M^c Carty dec^d calling for \$7.50 including interest which if taken from the sum of \$368.12 will leave a balance of \$360.62 cents all which we sub mit to the Court, March 8th 1834.
