rights title & interest in my parcel of the lands
on which he now lives, being about two thirds
of the same situated & lying in the township
County State aforesaid but the ground left
is not to be sold except under probt & after the
death of my grand mother Mary Kinmore.
I also give & bequeath unto Abraham Purgan
one fourth of a Saw mill sitting upon the lower
falls of the Abogash river. I also give &
bequeath to Stephen Martin a farm or one
thousand acres of land lying in Augusta and
Hennebaw County together with all my per-
sonal Estate in and about & about except one hun-
dred dollars which I will & bequeath to
John Thomas whom I do hereby appoint my
sole and only executor of this my will. And
I do hereby revoking all others, bearing
my express wish and intention that all my
debts be first paid and discharged out of
the personal property left. Then the said
Thomas to have the said dollars and the
balance to the said Weston
I do give & bequeath to Thomas
Wagoner the sum of \$1000 to

Pursuant to an order of the Boone County Court, the
subscribers have procured to be set off the dower
of Betsy Tourey in the land & slaves whereof the Victor Tourey
deceased died seized & possessed as shown to us by
James Johnson Guardian of the heirs &c.

The land property contained in a deed made by
Victor Tourey & wife to the said B. Tourey deceased being
into the hands of Sept 1811. Containing 108 acres of land
adjoining Tourey Town between the mouth of Day and
creek and second creek. Also lots in said Town number
one two three four five six seven eight nine ten eleven
twelve thirteen fourteen fifteen. And also two Negroes. Slaves to wit.

One boy about twelve or fourteen years of age
called a Laton & one girl about fourteen years
of age called a Clark. Out of which said
land & slaves. He after being first surveyed and
then and set off to said Betsy Tourey the two lots
in said Tourey Town number twelve & thirteen where
the said dwelling house house stands & the half lot
N^o 15 together with fifteen acres of land out of
the above said 108 acres which is adjacent to the
dwelling. Beginning at the S. E. corner of lot
number fourteen & thence with line of W. T. Tourey S
47. 30. E 26 poles to a stake or stone thence N 57. 3
E 17. 30. S 26 poles to a corner of the S. 108 acres near second
creek and thence with a line thereof down second
creek and into the Town lot to the Beginning
containing fifteen acres. Also the above said
Negro girl Clarissa. Given under our hands
this 9th day of March 1815
