Second it is my will and I hereby give to my beloved wife Sally Riddell during her natural life the lots 88 and 86 in the Town of Burlington on which is situated the house in which I now live which I likewise give to her during her natural life and I also will and bequeath to her during her natural life the one half of twenty acres of land lying in Boone County near the said Town of Burlington which twenty acres of land has been purchased of Union Christy by Doct: Richard Collins and myself and I also will and bequeath to my said beloved wife during her natural life my negro boy named Noble and it is my will and desire that she shall have the use of two large beds and one small bed and such bed furniture and bed clothing as she may choose to keep also all my Tables One Bureau and such chairs as she may think necessary, also such tables and Cupboard furniture and such cooking utensils as may be requisite for house keeping with comfort and Convenience If I prosper such at this time, also I give her one milch cow and I hereby do and appoint my Executors hereinafter named to obtain from William Goodridge sent a deed for said two lots in the town of Burlington and also to obtain from said Union Christy a deed for said land as soon as they conveniently can if said deeds are not made in my life time, which deeds if made after my death I wish made to my said beloved wife Sally Riddell so long as she may live thence after her death to my children and heirs in fee simple. of the Guardian of my said Children (which guardian
is herein after named) until such time as the Children
of my said wife shall respectively come of age.
Fifthly. I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint
Charles Chambers and Richard Collins Guardians of
my said Children Marcellus Cyrus, Addison and
Polly Ann and I do earnestly request him to act as
their Guardian and to pay particular attention to their
education and moral conduct.
Sixthly. It is my will that my said beloved wife have
the use of my cupboard in addition to what is herein -
before given and it is to be understood that the half
of the twenty acres of land above named is the western
