Amos Jeremiah born of the County of Boone and State of Kentucky, being in sound mind and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do make and publish this my last will and Testament in Order to bestow the worldly goods it hath pleased God to bless me with in manner and form following viz.
Item. my will is that the surplus of the stock and any other property, as shall not be needed for the use of the family in the opinion of my Executor shall be sold and all debts due me collected and of the proceeds thereof pay all debts that I may be owing and the balance which all other of my property both real and personal to be and remain in the hands of my executor for the use of the family, and for raising & educating my children.

Item. I give and bequeath to my six daughters to wit Falecia have, Elijah have, Polly have, Luisa have, Pemelia have, and Nancy have such property as my Executor thinks reasonable, when any one of them becomes of age, or gets married out of my said estate making an amount of the value thereof so that on a final division it may appear that each has received an equal share of my estate.

Item I lend unto my wife Polly have during her natural life or widowhood the tract of land where on I now live containing one hundred and eleven acres also one third of my slaves and other property and at her death, or in case she should get married then the said property to be divided equally amongst my said six children as aforesaid, named.

I do hereby constitute appoint and ordain Whitfield Early Executor of this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this eighteenth

I give and bequeath the following legacy to wit unto Nancy Hughes wife of Hugh Hughes formerly Nancy Graves, the said Graves, Polly Graves wife of Edw. Graves, formerly Polly Graves, Isaac Graves, Polly Graves, Martha Graves, and Thomas Graves, each, One Shilling in Gold or Silver coin of the United States to be raised out of my estate and paid over unto each, unto them and their heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give unto the heirs of Grace Graves dec'd. wife of Orin Graves formerly Grace Graves One Shilling each, of the coin of the United States to them and their heirs and assigns forever to be raised out of my estate and paid over unto them.

Item. I give unto Margaret Graves infant daughter of my son Jeremiah Graves dec'd. One Shilling in Gold or Silver coin to be raised out of my estate and paid over unto her, and unto her heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give unto my daughter Rebecca Graves One good Federick Red Bedstead and bedding, unto her heirs and assigns forever at the time of my death.

Item all the Ballance of parishable property which I may die seized and possessed of consisting of Horses, Cattle, Sheep and Hogs farming, tilth, household and kitchen furniture of every kind and nature, I leave unto my wife and friend Grace Cravens during her widow hood or in case she should ever marry during her natural life and at that time, it is my will and desire that all the aforesaid property, (or at the time of her marriage should such a thing were take place) should be equally divided among my other six children not before named in this my will viz. Benjamin Cravens, Anna Adams, wife of Thomas Adams formerly Anna Cravens and Rachel Cravens, Malinda Harrington wife of John Harrington formerly Malinda Cravens, John Cravens, and James Cravens, unto them & their heirs and assigns forever.

Item I wish all my lawful debts paid out of my Estate as speedily as possible.

I hereby appoint my son Benjamin Cravens Executor of this my last will and Testament, revoking all former wills and Testaments, this to be my last only true and lawful will. In testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal in the presence of the subscribing witnesses who were in the presence of each other this 6th day of January 1825.
