I John Graves of Boone County and State of Kentucky, being desirous to direct in what manner my property shall be disposed of after my death do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament in manner following to wit.

- 1st I give and bequeath to my son James Graves my negro Girl Rachel to him and his heirs forever.
- 2nd All the rest of my property, real and personal of every kind whatever to be sold in twelve months next and the proceeds thereof, together with all money that I may have, or such as may be collected on debts due me, to be equally divided among my children namely, Sarah Farnett, Susanna Graves, John Graves, Alexander Graves, Nancy James, Joseph Graves, James Graves, Edward Graves, Jeremiah Graves, and Reuben Graves, to them and their heirs forever. But with this proviso, that the negroes are to be sold, only among my said children.
- 3rd Having given to my son Stephen Graves in advance in his life time, more than any other of my children I therefore leave his heirs nothing by this will.
- 4th Should any Wife and Graves live after my death in that case my Executors are to retain in their hands a sufficiency of undivided money, for a comfortable support for her during life.
- 5th I hereby constitute and appoint my son Joseph Graves and my son in law George Graves, Executors of this my last will and Testament, Revoking all former wills made by me.

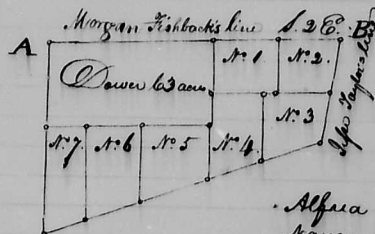
