I James M^cIntosh of the county of Boone
and state of Kentucky; being in sound mind and
memory, though near in years am desirous of disposing
of such estate as I may have, which it has pleased
God to bless me; He make and constitute that my last
will and testament in manner following to wit:

Item: First I give and bequeath unto my son John

M^cIntosh the tract of land containing eighteen
and a half acres wherein he is now residing in the
County of Boone and adjoining the lands of Robert
M^cIntosh, John Tamm, deceased, Jeremiah Sam
and others, to him, his heirs and assigns forever

Also I give and bequeath to my said son
John thirty dollars to be paid out of any money
due me when collected.

Also I give and bequeath to my daughter, Mary
McIntosh fifteen dollars to be paid in like manner.

Item: Secondly, my will is that my executor shall
sell all my property of every description (that is
not already bequeathed) on a credit of twelve
months and the money arising therefrom with
all money due me by bond, note or open account
and all money that I have in possession after
paying my just debts, shall be equally divided
between my following children to wit
William, Robert, John, James, Mary,
James

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James, Fanny, & Kate, Phelps Tamm to them
and their heirs forever.

Lastly I hereby appoint, Absalom Graves executor
of this my last will and testament revoking all
former wills heretofore made, and declare this
to be my last will and testament.
