 of perished mind and memory calling unto
 mind the mortality of my Body and know-
 ing that I am appointed for all new
 ones to die do make & ordain this my
 last Will and Testament first I recommend
 my soul into the hand of Almighty God
 that I may go to his glory and my body to be buried in
 decent Christian Burial at the discretion
 of my Executors and as to the Worldly Goods
 which with the Lord hath blessed me with
 I give in the following Manner and
 Form — It is my voice that my Wife
 Aron Louie Thomas Hawkins John
 Hawkins Peggy Mahan David Woodcock
 Jane Jameson Joseph Hawkins & Sally
 Terrell enjoy what property I have
 hereof or give them with out being called
 to render an account of it.
 And It is my Will that what property
 I now have in possession be divided
 Between my two sons Thomas and Jo-
 seph Hawkins in the following man-
 ner To wit That Thomas Hawkins
 is to have my least parcel more or
 three cows and their calves or yearlings
 and my Bed and Bed Clothes and
 that Joseph Hawkins have any of my
 said more 3d Jameson Hawk-
 ins of Boone County and State of
 Kentucky gave me his note for
 four hundred Dollars for
 redemption of a negro man
 named _____ the date

this time, he recollected, and since
that has given up the said negro woman,
and his Note, was to be given up to
him. But cannot at this time give
it to him, and utterly deny transferring it to
any person. It is my will, that they es-
cort him give him up his Note, if to be found
if not that they give him a clear receipt
as he is further is a wrong in this thing
1st. I appoint my two sons, Thomas
and Joseph, Executors to the
my last Will and Testament, in tes-
timony whereof, I have come to with my
hand and seal this 6th day of September
1812

Whereas John Dulaney late in his life,
died in the year 1812 made his last Will
& Testament, in which he devised his
whole Estate to his Mother and his brother
Benjamin & James & his Sister Susan who
has since intermarried with Walter Good-
ridge, devising to the said Benjamin one
Negro (Male) named Abram who has since
died and no more - and whereas so-
pho Graves was after the death of said
John Dulaney appointed by the County
Court of Rowan Administrator with the
Will annexed, of the last Will of said
and took upon himself the duties there-
of - now in order to make a final
adjustment of all the concerns of said
Estate, we of the said Susan Dulaney as
Mother of said John Dulaney, Walter Goodridge
as husband of said Susan Sister of said
and said James who is yet under age by
Charles Dulaney his guardian, being all the
persons devised of said Decedent have this
day settled with said Joseph Graves
as Administrator as aforesaid, and
we do from him the whole of the Estate
of said Decedent and do hereby release &
discharge him from any & every claim
or demand which now or devise shall
or may have to said Estate.
