will do what is right and just each other.

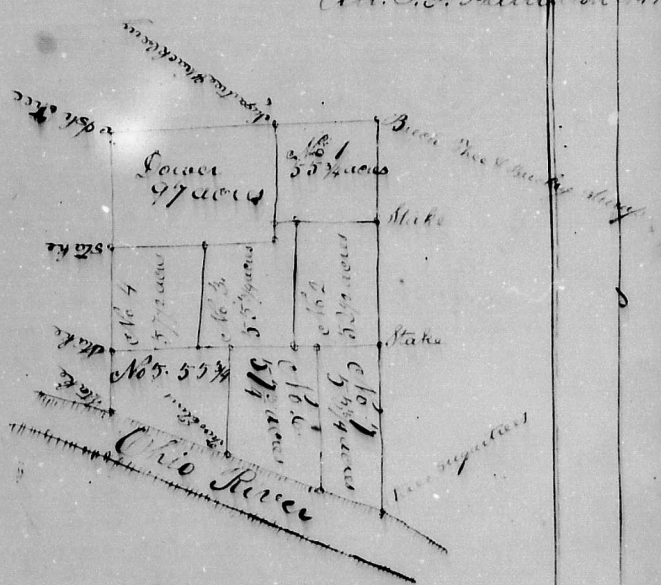
