But I give to my son Elisha Grist Twenty five

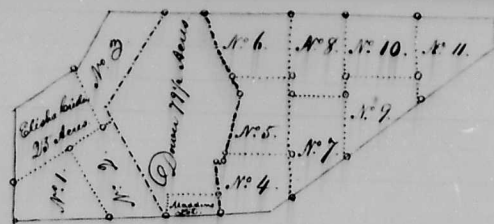

Herod and bring them up, to the profession of the law, I would be glad to have him do so, but if not, I wish them to be brought up to get their living by their honest industry I wish also these 3 men Ephraim Palmer Thomas Nelson, and William Rice, to sell my personal property at another months credit & pay my debts and rent out my land to some good man who will take care of it for the children, and pay themselves for their trouble out of the rent and of them 3 men Ephraim Palmer, Thos.
