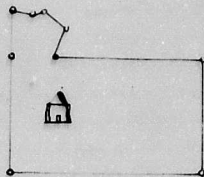


Boone County, Dec. Court 1837.
This Inventory and sale Bill of the Estate of Mitchell
Conrad was this day produced in Court examined and
ordered to be recorded, Whereupon the same is duly
recorded,

In conformity to an order of Boone County Court Dec.
Term 1836 appointing us Commissioners to allot and set apart
the dec. of M. Mitchell Conrad's widow and child of the late
Joseph Conrad dec. in and to the lands, slaves and personal
estate of said dec. in Boone County, we the undersigned do
On the 7th July 1837, proceed to allot and set apart as her
dowry in and to the lands of said dec. One hundred and
twenty six acres, as represented on the above plat which
is included in the tract known by the name of the Hall
tract of 116 acres and also a small tract of ten acres
chartered of William Gaines by said dec. in his lifetime the
entire boundary of which is as follows to wit:

Beginning at an ash and fallen Beech corner to the calvert
lot in a line of James Gaines thence North 40 East 175
poles to a hickory and small bush at the head of a drain
thence N 50 E 148 po. to a sugar tree on the East side of a
drain in a line of George Gibson thence S 80 W 19 po.
thence S 87 W 10 po. 17 po. 10. 26 po. to two sugar trees and
two hickory near the mouth of a drain on the East side
of said run down the meanders of said run N 26 W 28 po.
to a hickory tree to S. Gaines line on the East side and
a hickory on the west side, corner to Washington Watts
thence which said Watts line S 80 W 135 poles to a stake
corner to the Hall tract and also a corner of said Watts
thence N 50 W 106 poles to the beginning.

We also proceeded in conformity of the same order to allot
of the slaves and personal estate of said dec. the following
(to wit) One negro Woman Ophelia and her children Tom,
Claire, Pimelia & Amanda. Valued to be worth Eleven
hundred and fifty dollars, and personal property to the
amount of five hundred eighty four dollars, & cents making
in all seventeen hundred thirty four dollars, & cents which
is fifty five dollars 98 cents more than the one third part
of said dec. estate it being valued at five thousand
thirty four dollars and 41 cents, all of which is now
paid.

Mr Lewis Webb, William Gaines and Benjamin Watts,
Commissioners appointed by the Boone County Court at
this Dec. Term 1836. to divide the land, slaves and
other personal estate of which the late Joseph Conrad dec.
did possessed of in the County of Boone amongst said
deceased heirs proceeded to make said division ac-
cordingly, to wit:

To John P. Graves after having allotted the dower the
one half of the remainder of the land containing 187
acres. Also to John P. Graves the other one half con-
taining also 187 acres, without designating any di-
vision line in consequence of the said John P. Graves
having purchased of the said John P. Graves his
part of said land, and they both being of lawful
age, all of which we respectfully report to Court
