 Cherry, County of Boone and State of Kentucky, being weak in
 body but in perfect mind calling to mind, that it
 is appointed for all men once to die, do make and
 Ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is
 to say principally and first of all I give and recom-
 mend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that
 give it, and my body I commend to the earth to be
 buried in decent Christian burial, nothing doubting
 but at the General resurrection, I shall receive the
 Same again, by the mighty power of God, and as
 touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased
 God to bless me in this life, I give devise &
 dispose of the same in the following manner &
 form, First, I give and bequeath to Mary my
 dearly beloved Wife, the one third of my estate
 real and personal during her life, And I give
 to my well beloved son John Cherry, two hundred acres
 of land, and one Negro man, named William
 (both I have given a Deed of Gift for) further my
 Sister Watch and the one fifth part of my horses,
 Cows, hogs, Sheep and household furniture, also I
 give unto my daughter Catharine, forty pounds to
 be raised out of my personal estate to make her
 even with Jack Arnold and Thomas Hall, Also to
 my Daughter Bulah one bay mare and colt and
 two hundred dollars, to be raised out of my
 personal estate, and the balance of my estate
 Real and personal except hands notes

notes or book acct, to be equally divided between Mary
 Arnold, Catharine Cherry, Cynthia Hall and Bulah
 Cherry, I likewise constitute make and ordain
 Moses Scott and Thomas Hall, the sole executors of
 this my last Will and Testament, In Witness
 Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal, this day
 the first of February in the year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred and ten
