2nd I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sally Muthhead surname & name, to have to her during her natural life and then to her children forever.

3rd I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Betsey Susanon surname & name, named Eliza during her natural life and then to her children forever.

4th I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Polly Ann Rogers surname & name, named Elmeda during her natural life and then to her children forever.

5th I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas an negro boy named Jack to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

7th I give & bequeath unto my daughter Julia an negro girl named Mary during her natural life & then to her children forever.

My will and desire is that my daughter Mary after named shall have and my negro woman Maria from time to time until my daughter Julia shall be the age of twenty one years and then the said negro and her increase should there be any after this date and the money arising from her be equally divided between my children before named after paying off my debts funeral Expenses &c.

It is my will and desire that if either of my said children shall die without leaving children then in that case and at that death the negro or other property held by devise under this will shall go to and be equally divided among my surviving children and their children in the same manner and under the same conditions that I have hereby devised to them as property.

I constitute and appoint Willis Graves as Executor of this my last will and Testament.

Soule in the City of Cincinnati being very weak of body but of sound mind & memory and considering the uncertainty of this mortal life do make & publish this my last will & Testament to men now and forever following that is to say after all my just debts and funeral charges are paid I give devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Ann Smith all my Estate both real and personal of what kind or nature soever to be held and enjoyed by her during her natural life and at her decease to descend to my several children, to wit William Benjamin, Francis, Elizabeth, Nathaniel, Ann, Roskinson and Patrick to be equally divided among them share and share alike to them their heirs assigns forever. It is further my will & desire that my said several negroes be liberated and discharged from slavery at the time appointed in the terms & stipulations hereafter mentioned that is to say my negro man Chadrack, to serve his term next succeeding the day of the date of this my last will and Testament & then to be free & to himself also my negro boy Tom now about seven years old to serve until he arrive to the age of thirty three years and then in like manner to be free & to himself and lastly I do hereby appoint my said wife Ann Smith my sole executrix of this my last will and Testament to do by & to keep all former wills by me made in Witness Whereof I have
