desirous to direct the disposal of such worldly
estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with
do give and bequeath the same in manner

manner following To wit I lend to my beloved
wife Winnefred Dickson during her life or Widowhood
one third part of my Stock of Cattle sheep hogs house
hold and kitchen furniture and one third part of my
present Crop of Corn, wheat, Rye, hem and flax, &
when ever she shall marry or depart this life my
will is that the whole of the property that I have
lent her shall revert to my estate and be equal-
ly divided between my five youngest Children
namely James Dickson, Richard Dickson, Betsy
Dickson, Julia Dickson, and William Dickson, to them
and their heirs forever, Item my Will and desire
is that two thirds of my Stock of Cattle sheep hogs house
hold ^{& kitchen} furniture, and two thirds of my present Crop
of Tobacco, Corn, Wheat, Rye, hem and flax
also my Waggon and gear, Wheelbarrow & plan-
tation tools shall be sold by my executors on
twelve months Credit taking bond & Security
and the money arising therefrom after
paying my just debts to be equally divided
between my five Children as aforesaid namely
James Dickson, Richard Dickson, Betsy Dickson
Julia Dickson and William Dickson to them
and their heirs forever, My desire is that if
my Death shall take place in any year after
the tenth of March, that the Crop in that
year shall be divided in the same man-

manner as is directed respecting the present test.
 Also my desire is that my Executors shall
 collect all debts due me by bond note or
 open account, and after paying my last
 debts, to be equally divided between my
 five children as above named to them &
 their heirs forever. Item I hereby con-
 stitute and appoint my sons James Dick-
