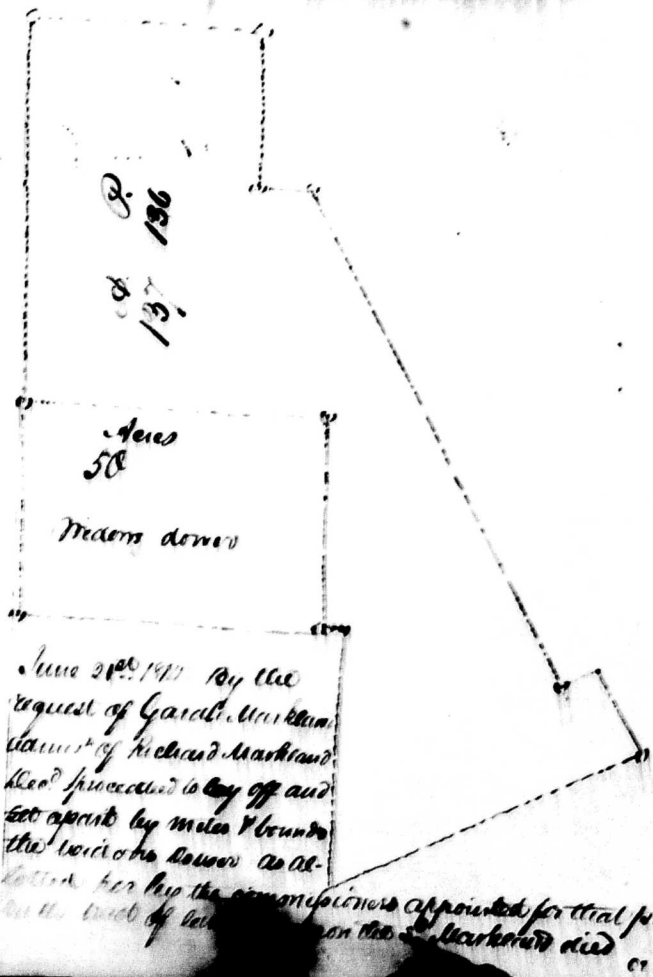

In conformity to the laws of this State, we the undersigned do hereby proceed to commit to writing the summative will of the late Richard Slack Esquire whose death took place on the third inst. at about five o'clock. AM and which was in point of substance was follows viz. In the first place the said decedent willed that all his just debts should be paid as speedily as the law justifies the payment of the debts of other deceased persons by the sale of such property belonging to his estate as could be most conveniently spared by his family that after the payment of those debts were so expended his beloved wife Elizabeth Slack should possess and enjoy during her natural life or widowhood, the remaining part of his the said decedent's estate both real & personal and that in case of the want of his marriage or death of his said wife the then remaining part of his the said decedent's whole Estate should be equally divided among the whole of his children. The value of the property which they may have already received by way of donation from the said decedent
