In the name of God Amen. I Richard Parkers of the
County of Boone and State of Kentucky, being in perfect
mind and memory, Calling to mind the Certainty of
Death and the uncertainty of the time when it may
happen, have concluded to make constitute & ordain
this my last will and testament in the following
manner and form. To wit, First & Principally
I commend my soul into the hands of the
Almighty, the Father of all Worlds; & my body
to the earth to be decently interred at the

discretion of my executors, And as touching those worldly goods where with it hath pleased God to bless me I devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

First I desire that my children may each inherit an equal portion of my estate the whole of which is remain and be in the hope of my beloved Wife Hannah Parker, to be given and divided out to each as they become of age or many, in such portions as she in her discretion may think proper; having in view that they are to be made equal, or as nearly so as may be, at the last division.

Secondly, I do appoint my beloved Wife, Hannah Parker, Executrix, my son Sam and Samuel Hawkins, Executors to this my last Will and Testament, revoking and nullifying all former Wills and Testaments by me made,

Conditioned agreeable to law, Certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate thereof in due form.
