I Edward Faulder of the County of Boone
State of Kentucky being in full
possession of sound memory, thinking that my
days not to be long or many to come, and
that Death is certain to all living, I having
presence of mind now at this time to
make a will to give and bequeath my
property away in such a manner as may
suit me best, do constitute and make
this my last Will and Testament
revoking all former bequests or wills
gifts &c. After my lawful debts
shall be paid, funeral expenses &c. that
then I give and bequeath to my loving
Wife Rachel Faulder, all and singular
my estate both real & personal, the place
called where I now live including of
one hundred acres of land, during her
life, and all my other property to
be vested in her to her own use to
dispose of as she may think best for her
own support, during her life, and at her
decease, shall have full power & authority
to dispose of the same as she may see
cause, amongst my children, In Testimony
my whereunto I have hereunto set my hand
and seal the 22nd day of July 1811
I do hereby appoint my Edward Faulder
Executor of all my estate
