2nd My will and desire is that after the death of my beloved wife Sally Robinson that all the property belonging to my estate be equally divided amongst my children (to wit) Elizabeth Draper, the heirs of Pelly McIntire dec'd. My grand children is to have one eighth part of s^c property to be divided amongst them, Lucy Reale, Landon Robinson, James Robinson, Mariah Hedges, Stephen Robinson and Sally Hedges to them and their heirs and assigns forever, with this exception that the estate both real and personal be bequeathed to my daughters as aforesaid is only left to them during their natural life and then to the heirs of their body. 3rd I hereby appoint my sons Landon Robinson, James Robinson, and Stephen Robinson the Executors of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I the said Stephen Robinson have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty third day of June One thousand eight hundred and twenty six.

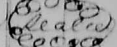
