

In the name of God Amen I Templeman Sandford of the County of Boone and State of Kentucky being in sound sense and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in order to bestow the worldly goods it hath pleased be to bless me with in manner and form following.

1st It is my will and desire that my debts be paid as early as practicable.

2nd I do hereby lend unto my wife Catharine Sandford during her natural life all my property both real and personal after my debts is paid and at her death to be equally divided between my two children to wit Sarah Sandford and Margaretta Sandford.

3rd It is my desire that my executor if he thinks it necessary for my wife Catharine Sandford should wish it that he shall sell one or more of my slaves.

4th And lastly I do hereby appoint Whitfield Early my Executor of this my last will and Testament and it is my will that it shall be required of him to give bond or security as such but be permitted to act as such without security.

I James Kyle of the County of Boone and State of Ky. being sound in mind but infirm in health and God feeling that my dissolution may probably be near make this my last will and testament and to supersede all other writings or words that may be found among my possessions or elsewhere.

I first leave my land to be divided between William Hogan and John W. Kyle. My three sons as follows To William Kyle all that part of my land that lies under Tinsawder hill, the length equal to the tract on which he lives, the west line to be the center of the east bench from the top of the hill; Subscribed to be that does also two negroes named Colli & Sally the whole valued at seven hundred dollars.

To my son Larkin I give a black boy named this person and a girl which I formerly gave him named Mary valued at seven hundred dollars.

To my son James Kyle I give that tract of land on which he resides one black boy named Jackson and one named Becca all valued at seven hundred dollars.

To my son Eliza Kyle I give a black boy named John and one named Henry valued at six hundred dollars.

To my daughter Mary I give a black boy named Charles and a girl named Mary to her and the heirs & her boys but not to Moses or William Scott. I also give William Nelson a black boy named Stephen the three valued at nine hundred dollars.

To my son David Kyle I give a black boy named William and a girl named Harriet and one hundred forty dollars that I paid for his land in all six hundred dollars.

To my son Hogan Kyle I give the half of home tract of land after William is taken off and as he has purchased my son John's interest in the said tract of land the title for both their shares will go to Hogan Kyle give him my part of the last purchase of Bank land also one black girl named Lacey to be

G. McHorn, ninety years of age and then she is to be sold and Testam^t named Jack one named Woodford and I do not to Hannah and my part of a Boy may see why he owning the other part of him also one Bed and furniture besides his own and my part of the wagon and what belongs to it boy name Jacob.

To my son John W. Kyle I give the half of my home tract of land which he was sold to Hogan Kyle also one black boy named Sam one named Wesley the whole valued at five hundred dollars.

It is also my will that old Rachel and Mary shall be free.

Whatever property I may leave that is not named in this will I wish for to be sold and the proceeds to be divided so as to make all my children as near equal as possible according to the valuation that I have made of the property excepting Hogan Kyle whose portion is named to him.

It is my will they consenting that William Hogan Kyle be Executors of this my will & Testament.
