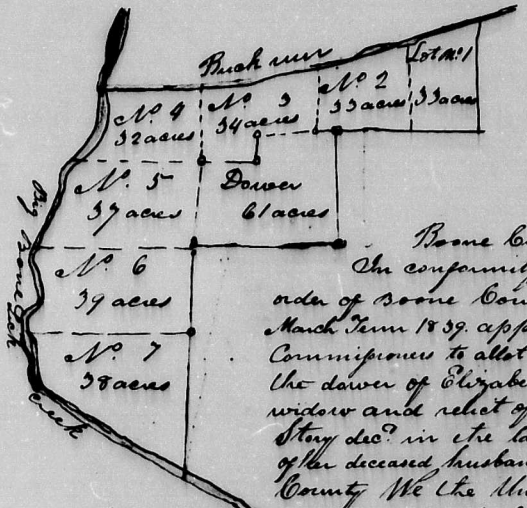

In conformity to an order of Boone County Court March Term 1839, appointing us Commissioners to allot and set apart the dower of Elizabeth Story widow and relict of Thomas P. Story dec^d in the land and dower of her deceased husband in Boone County We the Undersigned

Commissioners being just duly sworn do report that as far as came to our knowledge the lands of said dec^d consisted of a tract of 307 acres of land on Big Bone Lick Creek in the vicinity of the Big Bone Licks and that we did assign to said widow her dower 61 acres of the afo^d tract including the dwelling house and a reasonable portion of the wood lands the boundary of which is hereunto annexed.

We also further report that the slaves of said dec^d as far as came to our knowledge consisted of a negro woman and four children the value of each one respectively is as follows To wit

- Fanny \$500 00
- Virginia 350 00
- Napoleon 275 00
- Mary 225 00
- Jacob 150 00
- \$1500 00

We also further report that we did assign to the afo^d Elizabeth Story as her dower in and to the above named slaves the afo^d negro woman Fanny being as we conceive one equal third in value Given from under our hands as commissioners afo^d this 3^d day of April 1839.

In conformity to an order of Boone County Court March Term 1839 appointing us Commissioners to divide the lands of Thomas P. Story dec^d among the heirs of said dec^d We the undersigned being just duly sworn do report that the lands of said dec^d in Boone County as far as came to our knowledge consisted of a tract of 307 acres of land in the vicinity of Big Bone Licks the balance after assigning 61 acres to the widow as her dower we divided into seven lots among the heirs as hereafter reported We also assigned to Johnson Story one of the heirs 32 acres in a separate tract of land on which said Johnson now lives as his equal portion of the lands of said dec^d - We further report that the lots as we conceive are equal in value and were allotted as follows To wit -

Story dec^d in the vicinity of Big Bone Licks Beginning at a sugar hickory and ash in a line of Ben Funnell thence north with said line 180^o 98 poles to three hickory trees corner of said Funnell thence North 50 poles to a stake thence North 20 W. 20 poles to a stake thence North 62 poles to a stake thence N. 80 W. 78 poles to two Elm & a plum tree thence south 112 poles to the beginning containing 61 acres ~

Surveyed April 3rd 1839, for the heirs of Thos. P. Story 246 acres of land on the Big Bone Lick Creek and divided it into seven lots among the heirs as follows To wit

Lot N^o 1 Beginning at an elm red oak and two iron-wood corner of James D. Kelly in Shert's line on the west bank of Buck run thence with said line west 74 poles to a hickory elm and ironwood near a drain thence with a line of B. Funnell North 65 poles to a Spanish oak thence East 40 poles to a locust stump on Buck run thence up it by its meanders to the beginning containing 35 acres.

Lot N^o 2 Beginning at a locust stump on Buck run corner of Lot N^o 1 thence with said line West 75 poles to a Spanish oak in Funnell's line thence with it North 7 poles to an Elm haw bush and buckeye thence East 62 poles to a stake on Buck run thence up it by its meanders to the beginning containing 33 acres—

Lot N^o 3 Beginning at a stake on Buck run thence west with Lot N^o 2 62 poles to an Elm haw bush and buckeye in a line of the dower thence with it North 49 poles to a stake thence North 16.25 poles to a stake corner of the dower also thence North 33 poles to a stake thence East 76 po. to a Cherry tree and haw bush on the road thence with the road to Buck run and up it to the beginning containing 34 acres—

Lot N^o 4 Beginning at a Cherry tree and haw bush on the road corner of Lot N^o 3 thence with it west 76 poles to a stake in a line of the Dower thence with it and passing a corner thereof North 95 poles to a haw bush on Big Bone Lick Creek thence up the Creek to the mouth of Buck run thence with it and the road to the beginning containing 32 acres

Lot N^o 5 Beginning at a haw bush on the Creek corner of N^o 4 thence with said East south 66 poles to a stake corner of the dower thence with it and passing a corner thereof N. 82 W. 82 poles to a hickory and buckeye in a line of a survey made for N. Dudgeon thence North 82 poles to a boxelder on Big Bone Lick Creek thence up the center of the Creek to the beginning containing 37 acres.

Lot N^o 6 Beginning at a boxelder corner of Lot N^o 5 on the Creek thence south 82 poles to a hickory and buckeye thence East 80 poles to a red oak and ironwood thence North 80 poles to the Big Bone Lick Creek thence up the center thereof to the beginning— containing 39 acres—

Lot N^o 7 Beginning at an Elm and oak on the Creek corner of Lot N^o 6 thence with a line thereof south 80 poles to a Red Oak and Ironwood thence west 104 poles to a Black Locust and two haw bushes on the Creek thence up it excluding the reserve of two acres to the beginning containing 39 acres.
