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In the name of God Amen, I Thomas Brown
of the state of Kentucky and County of Boone
being sick and weak in body, but of sound mind
memory and understanding, and considering the
certainty of death and the extreme uncertainty of
life, and to the end I may the better be prepared
to leave this world, whenever it shall please God
to call me hence, do therefore make and declare
this my last will and Testament in manner
following to wit. — First and principally I
commit my soul into the hands of Almighty
God my Creator hoping for pardon and
remission of all my sins; and to enjoy everlasting
happiness in the world to come; my body I commit
to the earth to be decently interred at the discretion
of my executors hereafter named. I nominate
& appoint William H. H. H. and William H. H.
as executors of my last will & Testament with full
instructions that all my funeral expences I just debts
to be paid as soon after my decease as conveniently may be.
Next I give & devise all my mortgages land tenements
and hereditaments whatsoever situate lying & being
in the County of Boone & State of Kentucky (which I
possess and do) to Edward H. H. H. the wife of John
(leigh H. H. H.) with their executors and my
relatives wife, Mary H. H. H. for and during her life,
and from and after her decease, I give & devise the
same to my youngest son Thomas Brown and his
heirs. To my son Thomas Brown I give & bequeath
a little negro girl named Malinda. To my son
William Brown I give and bequeath a negro
called Nelson. To my son James Brown I give
bequeath a

Richard Brown Squire and bequeath a negro woman named Malinda; to my daughter Elizabeth Morgan Squire and bequeath a negro girl called Hannah; to my daughter Sarah Henry Squire & bequeath a negro woman named Malinda; to my daughter Sarah Robinson Squire and bequeath a negro woman named Liza; to my daughter Henry Carlman Squire & bequeath a negro woman named Dolly; to my daughter Peter Pitt Squire & bequeath a negro woman named Sarah

to my son William Brown Squire and devise a tract of land in the Mississippi Territory the rest of my land in that country I want to be equally divided among all my sons & daughters

If I should be successful in establishing the right to a land claim in Spain about the Chickasaw with the tract to be equally divided among all my sons as well as my daughters

To my son Thomas Brown Squire & bequeath a horse mare about six or seven years old

All my stock of every description I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy Brown during her life; and at her decease to be sold & regularly divided among all my children

In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 21st day of March in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred & fourteen
